Fold paper in half. Cut around umbrella shape. On the inside of the book write about how rain forms.





Cut book out as one piece. Fold outer pieces to the inside (shutterfold). Write about lightning on one side and thunder on the other.

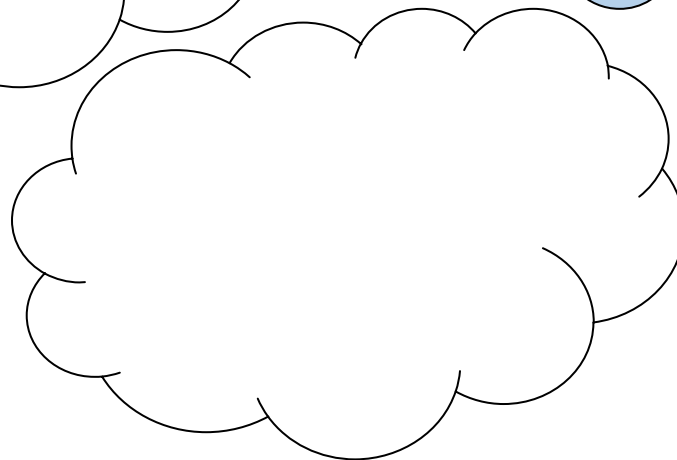
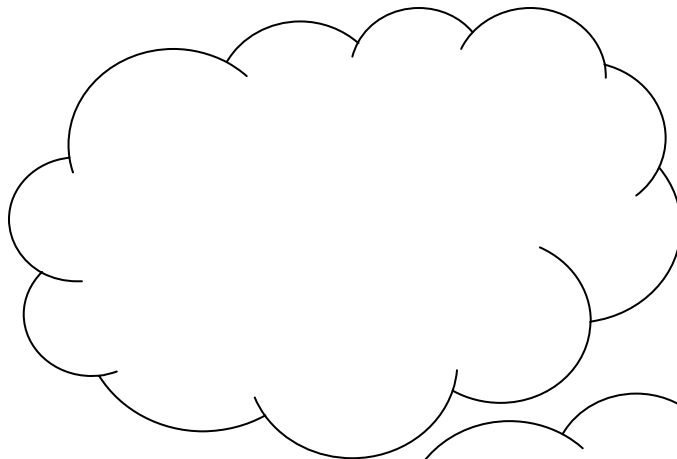
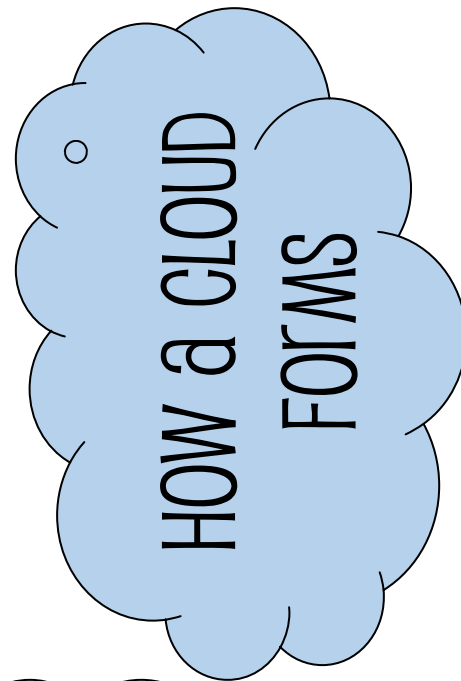
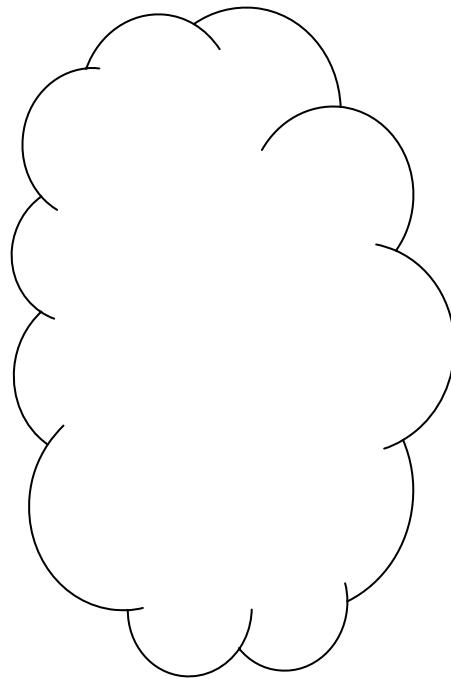
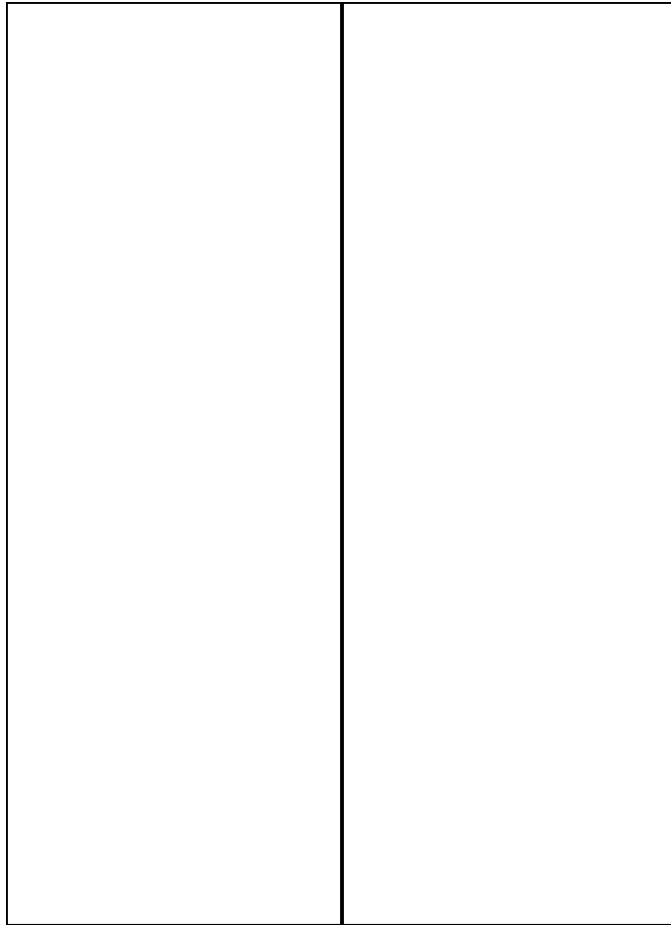
Cut book out as one piece. Fold bottom up. Add a tiny strip of glue to each side. Fold book in thirds with "new words" on the front. Cut strips out (from next page). Write one word or definition on each strip. Put out all the words and definitions. Let your student match them together. Place in pocket together as matched. Continue until finished. The definitions have been provided for you. Use the book (Weather Words and What They Mean) to help your student write the five snow words on the blank cards.




<b>snow that melts and refreezes before it hits the ground</b>	<b>when it snows lightly</b>

# Three Main Types



Cut out strip as one piece. Cut out piece with tab. Cut out cloud. Glue as indicated. Fold like an accordion. Paste cloud on the front of the book.

Glue this tab to the back of the last strip.

Cut out book as one piece. Cut on dotted lines. Fold left side under. Fold right side so that it is the cover of your book. We added this graphic— <http://img.infoplease.com/img/article/clouds.gif> to the inside of our book.

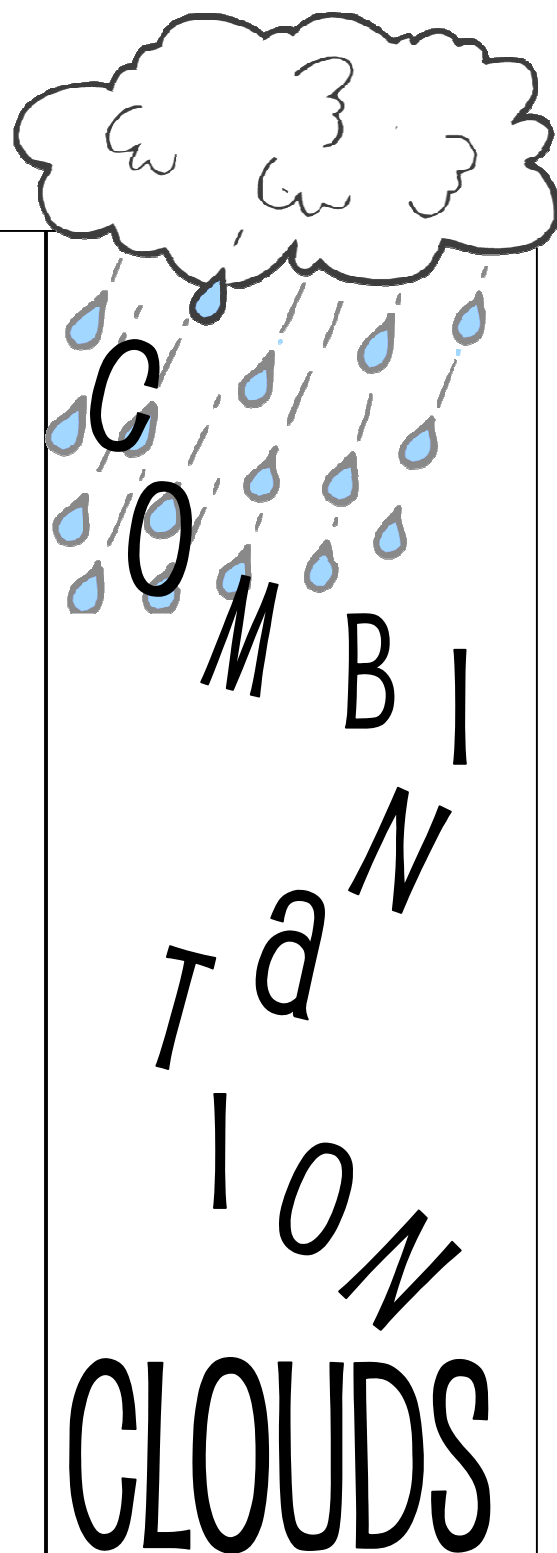

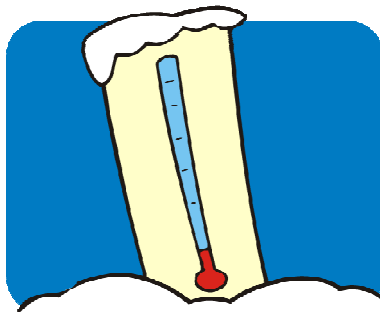

Cut out as one piece. Fold like an accordion. Paste back of last section to your lapbook.

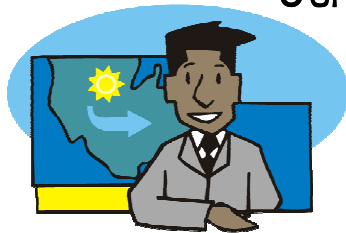
Inside the book write about changing temperatures (information found in *Weather Words and What They Mean*).

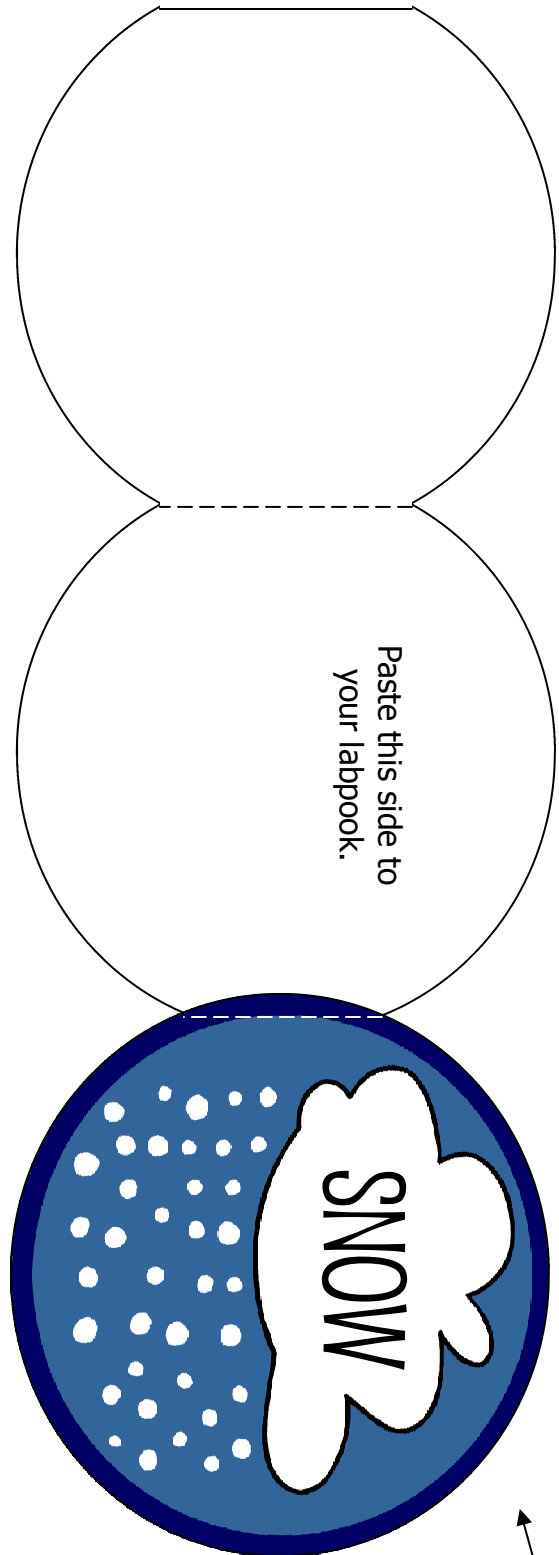
